A BILL

To require the Secretary of Agriculture to provide support for organic dairy producers and processors, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Organic Dairy Assist-
- 5 ance, Investment, and Reporting Yields Act of 2023" or6 the "O DAIRY Act of 2023".

7 SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF ELAP TO CERTAIN LOSSES IN8 CURRED BY ORGANIC DAIRY FARMERS.

9 (a) EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE FOR LIVESTOCK, 10 HONEY BEES, AND FARM-RAISED FISH.—Section

1	1501(d)(2) of the Agricultural Act of 2014 (7 U.S.C.
2	9081(d)(2)) is amended—
3	(1) by striking "used to reduce" and inserting
4	the following: "used—
5	"(A) to reduce"; and
6	(2) in subparagraph (A) (as so designated), by
7	striking "fever." and inserting the following: "fever;
8	and
9	"(B) to reduce losses incurred by organic
10	dairy farmers that are beyond those covered by
11	other disaster programs of the Department of
12	Agriculture, including losses that are caused by
13	an increase in organic feed or other input costs
14	that result in a cumulative decrease in net in-
15	come of more than 10 percent in any 1 calendar
16	year.".
17	(b) Streamlined Payment Process.—Section
18	1501 of the Agricultural Act of 2014 (7 U.S.C. 9081) is
19	amended by adding at the end the following:
20	"(g) Streamlined Payment Process.—The Sec-
21	retary, to the maximum extent practicable, shall stream-
22	line the process for making payments under this section.".

1 SEC. 3. IMPROVED DATA COLLECTION FOR ORGANIC 2 DAIRY. 3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Agriculture (re-4 ferred to in this Act as the "Secretary") shall provide sup-5 port for regional and national programs to collect and publish cost-of-production data for organic milk, including 6 7 data relating to-8 (1) the costs of major organic feedstuffs, in-9 cluding-10 (A) corn; (B) corn silage; 11 12 (C) soybeans; 13 (D) sorghum; 14 (E) oilseeds; 15 (F) small grains; 16 (G) forage crops; 17 (H) pasture; 18 (I) hay; and 19 (J) any other major organic feedstuff, as 20 determined by the Secretary; 21 (2) with respect to the costs described in para-22 graph (1), prices for—

23 (A) major organic feedstuffs produced do-24 mestically; and

25 (B) imported major organic feedstuffs; and PAT23927 Y95

(3) all other costs relating to the production of
 organic milk.

3 (b) ORGANIC ALL MILK PRICE SURVEY.—Not later 4 than 90 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the 5 Secretary shall establish a survey, to be known as the "Organic All Milk Prices Survey", which shall be analogous 6 7 to the existing All Milk Prices Survey of the National Ag-8 ricultural Statistics Service, to gather and report monthly 9 data about the amounts that organic dairy farmers are 10 being paid for the organic milk produced by those organic 11 dairy farmers and the prices received for organic milk cows, including-12

13 (1) national data; and

(2) data relating to, at a minimum, the 6 regions with the greatest quantity of organic dairy
production, as determined by the Secretary.

17 (c) Organic Milk Reporting.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days
after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary, using data collected by the National Agricultural Statistics Service, the Economic Research
Service, or the Agricultural Marketing Service, shall
publish new periodic reports that include, or add to
existing periodic reports, data for organic milk,

1	which shall be equivalent to data reported for con-
2	ventionally produced milk.
3	(2) REQUIREMENT.—Reports published under
4	paragraph (1) shall include, at a minimum—
5	(A) organic cost-of-production data by
6	State;
7	(B) regional data relating to the quantity
8	of organic milk production;
9	(C) organic mailbox price for the 6 regions
10	with the greatest quantity of organic dairy pro-
11	duction, as determined by the Secretary; and
12	(D) major organic feedstuff prices.

1 (2) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY.—Comments accept-2 ed under paragraph (1) shall be made available to 3 the public. 4 (c) REQUIREMENT.—In developing a proposal under 5 subsection (a), the Secretary shall ensure that— 6 (1) all organic dairy operations are eligible to 7 participate in the programs proposed to be estab-8 lished pursuant to that proposal; and 9 (2) those programs prioritize support for small 10 dairy operations (as determined based on the small 11 business size standard for the applicable North 12 American Industry Classification System code de-13 scribed in section 121.201 of title 13, Code of Fed-14 eral Regulations (or a successor regulation)). 15 (d) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 2 years after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall 16 17 submit to Congress a report that— 18 (1) includes recommendations relating to the 19 implementation of the proposal developed under sub-20 section (a); and 21 (2) describes any actions taken by the Secretary 22 to implement that proposal.

SEC. 5. INVESTMENTS IN ORGANIC DAIRY PROCESSING IN FRASTRUCTURE.

3 (a) INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT FUNDING PRO-GRAM.—Not later than 180 days after the date of enact-4 5 ment of this Act, the Secretary shall establish a program to provide funding for investments in infrastructure to en-6 7 hance regional organic milkshed markets that seek to 8 drive a greater affinity for regionally sourced and proc-9 essed organic dairy products by incentivizing support 10 for—

(1) the development of new organic dairy processing plants that support multiple regional small
dairy operations (as determined based on the small
business size standard for the applicable North
American Industry Classification System code described in section 121.201 of title 13, Code of Federal Regulations (or a successor regulation));

18 (2) initiatives that establish institutional pur-19 chasing of local organic dairy products;

20 (3) investment in infrastructure on farms and
21 in sites that aggregate raw milk to gain transport
22 and processing efficiencies;

23 (4) the establishment of on-farm organic dairy
24 processing and storage;

(5) producers and processors that want to expand regional organic processing infrastructure serv-

ing regionally produced organic milk from multiple
regional small dairy operations (as determined based
on the small business size standard for the applica-
ble North American Industry Classification System
code described in section 121.201 of title 13, Code
of Federal Regulations (or a successor regulation)),
including by—
(A) supporting work to finalize business
plans; and
(B) providing processor start-up capital;
and
(6) initiatives that support increasing regional
processing capacity to facilitate co-packing and toll-
ing for regionally produced organic milk from mul-
tiple regional small dairy operations (as determined
based on the small business size standard for the ap-
plicable North American Industry Classification Sys-
tem code described in section 121.201 of title 13,
Code of Federal Regulations (or a successor regula-
tion)).
(b) REGIONAL ORGANIC DAIRY MARKET SPECIAL-
ISTS.—
(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days
after the date of enactment of this Act, the Sec-
retary shall establish regional positions in each

1	major organic dairy producing region, to be known
2	as "Regional Organic Dairy Market Specialists"—
3	(A) to conduct research on the marketing
4	of organic dairy, including research relating
5	to—
6	(i) quality standards, including
7	changes in those standards over time;
8	(ii) cost-of-production data;
9	(iii) consolidation of, and lack of com-
10	petition among, buyers;
11	(iv) requirements for certification, in-
12	cluding changes in those requirements over
13	time;
14	(v) direct marketing of value-added
15	products at the farm level; and
16	(vi) the establishment and promotion
17	of new or existing regional organic dairy
18	brands that source regional milk; and
19	(B) to provide reports, recommendations,
20	and advice to the Secretary, organic dairy pro-
21	ducers and processors, Congress, and the public
22	with respect to the matters described in clauses
23	(i) through (vi) of subparagraph (A) and other
24	matters relating to the marketing of organic
25	dairy, including a report describing the options,

1	costs, and feasibility of establishing an organic
2	dairy insurance program through the Depart-
3	ment of Agriculture.
4	(2) REQUIREMENT.—A Regional Organic Dairy
5	Market Specialist may be—
6	(A) an employee of the Department of Ag-
7	riculture; or
8	(B) a position at a relevant institution of
9	higher education.
10	(3) RESEARCH TEAMS.—A Regional Organic
11	Dairy Market Specialist shall establish a research
12	team to assist the Regional Organic Dairy Market
13	Specialist in conducting the research described in
14	paragraph (1)(A).
15	(4) Period of support.—
16	(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall
17	enter into a commitment to provide support for
18	Regional Organic Dairy Market Specialists, and
19	the research teams established under paragraph
20	(3), for a period of 5 years.
21	(B) RENEWAL OF SUPPORT.—Subject to
22	the availability of appropriations, at the end of
23	a 5-year period of support, the Secretary may
24	renew the support of a Regional Organic Dairy
25	Market Specialist (and the research team of

1	that Regional Organic Dairy Market Specialist)
2	for 1 or more successive 5-year periods, pursu-
3	ant to such commitments as the Secretary de-
4	termines to be appropriate.
5	(c) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
6	are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary for
7	each of fiscal years 2024 through 2028—
8	(1) $$20,000,000$ to carry out subsection (a);
9	and
10	(2) \$5,000,000 to carry out subsection (b).
